How We Handle Personal Data

Personal data refers to information that can be directly linked to you as an individual, such as your name, email address, and company name. This information is necessary for us to serve you as a customer. We process personal data in connection with the facilitation and performance of our services, both on our own behalf and on behalf of our clients. This is done, for example, in the work of sending you relevant information you have requested.

a. Purpose of Processing

The purpose of processing your personal data is to identify you as a customer and fulfil the agreement you have with us.

Our processing of personal data is managed by our skilled employees. All employees at Credeva AS, Credeva Corporate Finance AS and Credeva Development AS ("the Company") are subject to confidentiality obligations. This confidentiality obligation applies not only outside the company but also internally between colleagues and continues even after the employment relationship has ended.

b. Types of Personal Data Processed

The types of information processed by the Company can be categorised as follows:

Administrative information such as name, telephone number, email address, job title, and the company you work for. Information about behavior on our website, such as which articles you read and what you show interest in.

c. Basis for Processing

We only collect information about you to send you relevant information you have requested to fulfil an agreement we have with you, or because we consider that we have a legitimate interest that does not outweigh your privacy rights.

If we need to process sensitive personal data to fulfil an agreement with you, we will obtain your consent in advance of the processing. The consent limits the processing to only include the information necessary for the Company to fulfil the specific agreement.

You may withdraw your consent at any time. The processing of the relevant personal data will then cease.

d. Disclose of Personal Data

Personal data may be disclosed to public authorities if required by law or mandatory disclosure obligations.

Any third parties that receive personal data from us are bound by confidentiality obligations through contractual agreements.

e. Retention of Personal Data

We do not store personal data longer than necessary to fulfil the purpose of the processing. If you have a customer relationship with us, personal data will be stored about you.

f. Right to Access, Rectification, Deletion, and Data Portability

Right to Access: You have the right to request access to the information we process about you. You have the right to know the purpose and legal basis for our processing, the information we process about you, the recipients or categories of recipients to whom the personal data is disclosed, the retention period of the personal data, and where the information was obtained from.

Right to Data Portability: You have the right to receive the personal data we have stored about you in a structured, commonly used, and machine-readable format. You also have the right to request that we transfer the data we have received from you to another data controller if technically possible and if the processing is based on consent or contract.

Right to Rectification and Deletion: If you believe that the Company has registered information about you that is inaccurate or incomplete, you have the right to request the rectification of the relevant personal data. You can request that we delete personal data about you if the information is no longer necessary to fulfil the purpose of the processing, if you withdraw your consent where consent was used as the legal basis for processing, if you object to the processing and there are no overriding legitimate grounds for continuing the processing, or if the information has been processed unlawfully.

g. Responsible Party for Data Processing

The data controller is the entity that determines the purpose of processing personal data and the means used. The Company has established a role for the data controller to oversee the processes, business areas, and systems that process personal data and to continuously follow

up on internal controls and risk situations. The role of the data controller is assigned to the Managing Director, Kjetil B. Grønmyr, who can be contacted as follows:
